Why are we using a salt alternative?

The city is now using an anti-icing liquid that is applied 24-48 hours before expected snowfall. The product is Potassium Chloride with a rust inhibitor, similar to what the State of CT uses. The liquid agent will be applied around schools, hills, overpasses, and other city and public safety facilities.

What benefits will this provide?

Using this solution will ensure increased roadway safety, increased environmental friendliness and increased cost savings compared to only using granulated salt products as recommended by the CT Dept. of Emergency Services and Public Protection.

PARKING

Once snow begins to fall, a parking ban is in effect on the even-numbered side of most roads, unless one is posted with a "No Parking" sign on the odd side.

The ban is in effect for 36 hours after a storm. Residents are urged to park in driveways or designated city parking lots, or private lots.



SNOW ROUTES

When a "Snow Emergency" is declared, no parking on both sides of:

- Campbell Avenue
- Savin Avenue
- Morgan Lane
- Elm Street
- Meloy Road
- Second Avenue (from Elm to Beach)
- Main Street (from Savin to Washington).

These roads must remain clear from 11pm to 7am.



AVAILABLE PARKING ALTERNATIVES

Residents may park their vehicles in any West Haven Public School parking lot, any municipal lot, or any beach parking lot.

Cars parked in school lots must be moved by 10am to allow for school lots to be cleaned and ready for schools to reopen.
